On Infrastructure: The College is housed in a custom-built complex set in an expansive serene green compound away from the town. Facilities required to provide quality education and maintain high standards of learning are fully provided. These include administrative offices, staff common rooms, meeting rooms, classrooms, medical laboratories, e-resource centre, library, equipped skills laboratories, computer laboratories, stores, a cafeteria and a Multipurpose hall. Students and lecturers have a 24 hour access to internet facilities supplied by KENET.

Our hospital expansion project to become the state of the art teaching and referral Hospital is done. Thereby we now have more specialized clinical areas, extra lecture theatres, resource centre and a library for the students. Our multipurpose hall has been completed and this has increased the numbers of lecture halls, offices, seminar rooms, and examination rooms among others.

Plans are underway to equip a state of the art skills lab and a library in line with our vision and integration of virtual live skill/ Dual learning. The infrastructure is ready in the MRI building

Admissions

The admission of the students is carried out by a duly constituted 'Admissions Committee under the office of the registrar. The Selection is purely on merit basis and in accordance with the guidelines of the regulatory bodies and the Ministry of Education. Currently, as of November 2023 we have 1763 students enrolled in the various courses offered and 448 students are graduating today.

We usually have intakes in January, March, May and September every year

On Implementation of the programs

We have a highly qualified pool of professional lecturers with degrees and higher degrees in training some who also work as staff in Outspan Hospital. The ratio of faculty to student is **1:13** which is within the recommended ratio by the Ministry of Education.

All our curricula are up to date in terms of approval and review by the relevant authorities.

New Post basic programs are also being developed in line with the market demands and regulatory bodies. We have already been approved to train HND in Critical care Nursing from this year others are in the pipeline which include HND in Oncology and palliative care, Nephlology, anesthesia, and theatre Nursing.

Accepted teaching methods are applied and modern technology is used to enhance dual training, notes are available electronically in the resource center, we are members of KLISC and we also have inter library partnerships. The college has adopted blended virtual e-learning to drive its academic programs. On yearly basis we take the faculty on refresher programs on pedagogic skills.

Guest of Honour Sir, 85% of our academic staff have been trained and certified in CBET (Curriculum Based Education Training) as trainers, assessors and verifiers in line with the country direction on matters of education and training. Currently we also have a public private partnership with Dedan Kimathi University of Science and technology and KSTVET where by most of our lecturers have acquired post graduate diploma in Technical Teacher education in line with the MOE requirement.

On Information Communication Technology

Outspan Medical College and Outspan Hospital is now connected with the rest of the world through a KENET network. This has enabled us to implement blended online teaching and assessments in all our programs and students can learn when in clinical areas. Most of our students were able to transit to the next level without losing academic time.

The college has come up with an evaluation program whereby the students are expected to do continuous assessment tests and assignments and this is to account for 30- 40% of the total end of trimester marks while the end of trimester assessment accounts for 60 -70% depending on the particular program. Skill assessments are also done in clinical areas as required in the curriculum. For the program under CDACC the students Portfolio of Evidence requirement are adhered to.

On **Performance**

The examinations office usually releases the results 6 weeks after the completion of trimester examinations. The performance for the 1st and 2nd trimester in the current academic year were impressive and majority of the students in the year 2022-2023 where able to proceed to the next academic year.

The external examination results were impressive. Nursing Council examinations done in April and August 2022 we registered a 96.5 % pass. The KNEC modular examination for Nutrition and dietetics and the psychology we recorded an average of 83% with majority having credit and distinction. We are still waiting for the CDACC assessments results. We thank God and appreciate the students and the faculty for the work well done.

We are an examination center for almost all the regulatory bodies in this region. 88% of the students who were expected to graduate satisfied the board of examiners for the award of diploma and certificate as detailed in the program.
